The assemblies and events will include class vs. class sporting events and an informal closing ceremony at the end of the week during the pep rally.

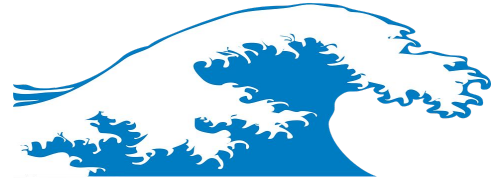
Additionally, SGA would like to propose dress down days on Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday in accordance to the student handbook and presented themes.

# DRESS DOWN DAY GUIDELINES

---

Monday -

- If sleeveless jerseys are worn, an **undershirt with sleeves is required**

Tuesday -

- Students: Dress down as your favorite teachers!
- Teachers: Dress down as your students or your favorite class to win for the Olympics!

Wednesday -

- Dress down representing different countries (USA is more than allowed)
- Flags, shirts, colors, and others that relate to the nation may be worn (must be appropriate)

Friday -

- Ultimate Baron Pride Day
- Facepaint, Black and Gold, beads, headwear, and others may be worn

# DRESS DOWN DAY GUIDELINES

---

- Jeans are permitted on all days. No holes or ripped jeans allowed.
- NO MASKS
- Headwear may be worn, but may be asked to be removed in classrooms.
- If shorts or skirts are worn, they must be as long or longer than the normal uniform bottoms.
- No weapons of any kind

See all other guidelines in the student handbook. Faculty has the right to require students to change into their school uniform if the outfit is deemed inappropriate, does not relate to the theme of the day, or does not follow the dress down guidelines.
